Trends

- 1 A total of 65 suspicious alerts on seven different sports were reported to the relevant authorities for further investigation in Q2 2020. This figure may be revised in future depending on the outcome of any ongoing investigations.
- 2 The 18 tennis matches were provided to the Tennis Integrity Unit (TIU) as intelligence reports as they do not relate to events sanctioned by the main tennis tours, albeit some players engaged in those events may fall within the scope of that body's Tennis Anti-Corruption Program (TACP).
- 3 The sports and locations for this quarter's alerts reflect the significant changes to the sporting programme caused by the COVID-19 outbreak.

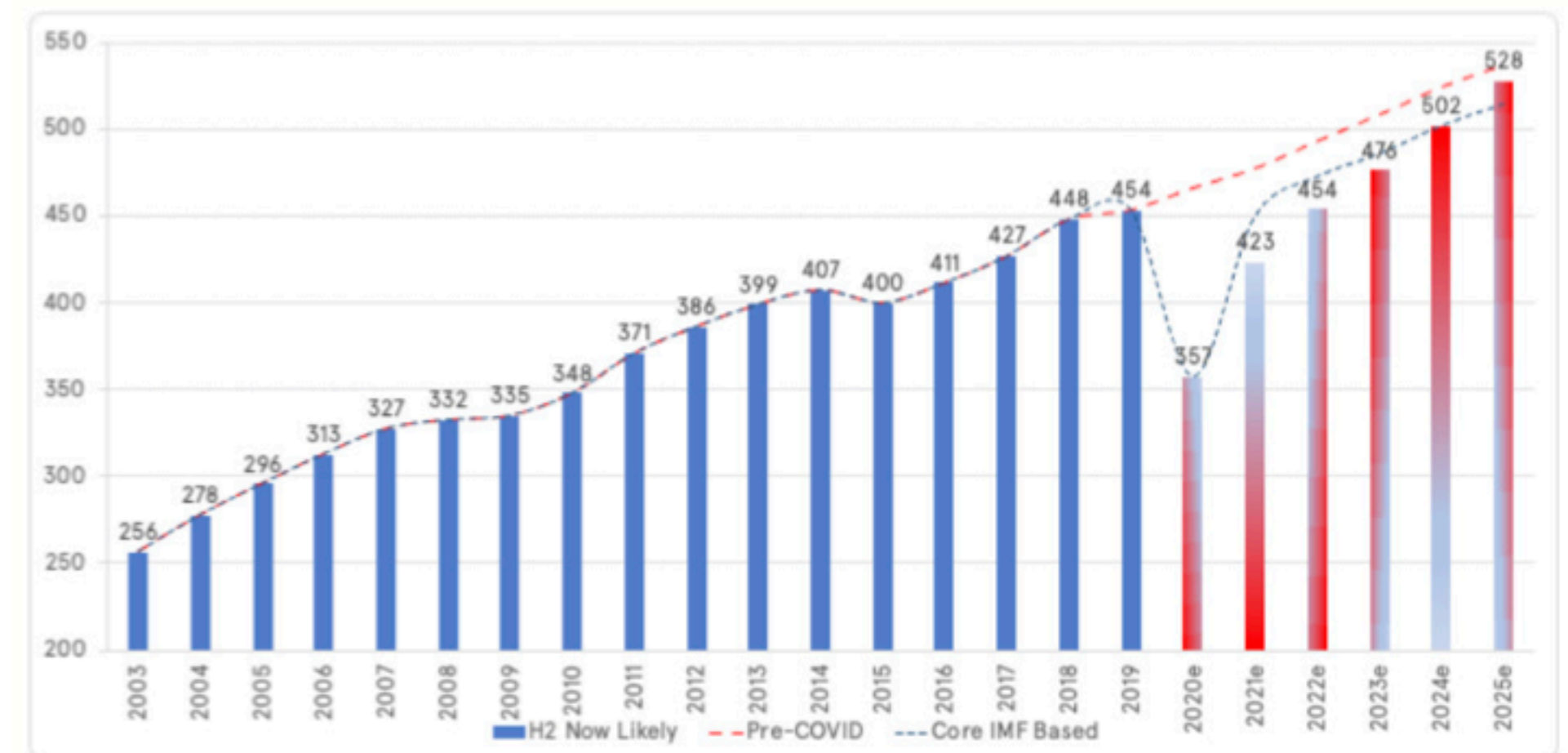


Global betting data

Numbers from the leading gambling market data company H2 Gambling Capital shows that the COVID-19 crisis has heavily impacted the growth of the gambling industry globally.

According to the latest figures, global industry growth is expected to fall to approximately -24% in 2020, corresponding to an estimated total gross win of US\$360 billion. This number is comparable to the global gross win achieved in 2011 and means that industry gross win is currently projected to fall to a nine-year low in 2020.
